I had met Leah in Puerto Galera. I was on a diving vacation and she was

a waitress in the hotel restaurant. An ATV accident resulted in injuries that required surgery and days in recovery in the hospital. Leah was my companion, in accordance with Filipino culture, watching over me and keeping me company. I was moved by her generosity and kindness. I paid for Leah's college education, roughly \$2500 for four years.


When I traveled to her graduation, family and friends offered money and gifts for Leah to acknowledge her accomplishment. I realized a small amount of money from many dedicated individuals could make a big difference in women's lives.

In February 2008, I created the Oregon-based nonprofit, Isis Initiative, Inc. We are a small yet mighty volunteer

## **Azmina: empowering girls**

In 2015, we offered financial support to Azmina Karim so she could complete Master of Arts in Gender and Peace Building at the University for Peace in Costa Rica.

Now Azmina Karim is the program director at Connecther, an NGO based in Austin.

She works remotely from Bangladesh on different projects which focus on empowering girls and women globally.

Azmina got to work closely with Girls Global Education Fund, which assists girls with financial need in going back to school. Among her other projects, she also got to work with a Burmese migrant

school in Thailand, where, with the contribution of <u>Connecther</u>, 40 students will be fed for one whole academic year. Not only that, the students also got a course on basic nutrition.

Azmina has a bachelor's in Asian Studies from Asian University for Women. She worked as a volunteer teacher at Minmahaw school, supported by a grant from Connecther.

Azmina's short film "Because I Am a Girl," a powerful indictment of domestic violence in Bangladesh, won the People's Choice Award at Connecther's Girls Impact the World Film Festival in 2013.

In June of 2015, Isis Initiative, Inc. offered a four-year scholarship to a student in the Philippines. Maryjoy Braggan Supang is now in her third year studying office administration at Governor Alfonso D. Tan College in Tangub City, and getting good grades. She hopes to graduate in March 2019.

Our "Leah's Dream" project offers funding to young women who have the desire but not the resources to pursue a college education. It was inspired by Leah Mamhot, who is now our liaison in the Philippines helping Maryjoy. On our 10th anniversary, we're glad to be able to help Leah get her master's degree in education, which she needs for her current teaching job. The cost is 7,000 Philippine pesos per semester, around \$138 in the U.S.

#### A \$500 grant helps a student with living expenses

We were excited to send a onetime \$500 grant to Michelle Simon, a

freshman with a full scholarship at The University of Nottingham Malaysia Campus.

Michelle is majoring in International Communication Studies with Film and TV studies. She
